

## **Competitive Coach**

This role requires a strong ability to communicate to athletes and parents with clarity, in terms of athlete expectations, selection and participation. The Competitive Coach will report to the Club Programs Manager and will also receive direction and guidance from the Lead Program Coach.

The Competitive Coach will represent the program and the Club with professionalism, respect and leadership. The time commitment and compensation will be as follows:

- · 30-35 hours/week for approx. 8-9 weeks @ \$16/hour. Starting as early as June 8, 2020
- Allowances will be made for those Competitive Coaches who require their own daily training with days off as needed

## **Responsibilities:**

- Assist with the development and implementation of a training program for competitive athletes in coordination with Club Programs Manager and Lead Program Coach.
- Coach Junior Development (U17,19) and Masters groups.
- Coach Train to Train and Masters Development programs.
- Provide technical feedback to athletes and facilitate athlete learning
- Assist in the enforcement of SNRC rules and safety policies
- Promoting and recruiting members for the SNRC
- Maintain an energetic, inclusive and positive attitude toward all athletes both on and off the water
- Maintain a safe environment at all times
- Fueling boat motors, small boat repair and organizing boat trailer
- · Assisting with general club clean up and maintenance

## **Requirements:**

- Must be under 30 years of age (requirement for CSJ grant funding)
- Must have own transportation
- Must have competitive rowing experience
- Must have motor boat license (Pleasure Craft Operator)
- Must have First Aid/CPR/AED
- Must have good communication and organizational skills
- Previous coaching experience is preferred
- RCA Coach Level 1 training is an asset
