Novice Coach

This role requires a strong ability to work with youth who are new to the sport and offer an inclusive and supportive environment to help ensure the participants enjoy their program experience. The Novice Coach will report to the Club Programs Manager and will also receive direction and guidance from the Lead Program Coach.

The Novice Coach time commitment and compensation will be as follows:

- Up to 30 hours/week for approx. 7 weeks @ \$14.50/hour and starting July 6th, 2020
- Allowances will be made for those Novice Coaches who require their own daily training with days off as needed
- Hours: Generally, Monday to Friday, 8:30am-12:30pm and 5:45pm to 8:15pm.
- Extra hours will be required for promotional events and club maintenance.

Responsibilities:

- Assist with planning, implementing and operating Youth Camp, a half-day camp offering 11-15 year olds the opportunity to learn the sport of rowing and develop new skills in a fun and supportive camp environment.
- Assist with coaching Masters Development, Adult Recreational and Train to Train programs
- Assist the Club Programs Director and other coaches as required
- Assist in the enforcement of SNRC rules and safety policies
- Assist with promotional events for the SNRC
- Maintain an energetic, inclusive and positive attitude toward all athletes both on and off the water
- Carry out fueling boat motors & cleaning docks
- Assisting with general club clean up and maintenance

Requirements:

- Must be under 30 years of age (requirement for CSJ grant funding)
- Must have own transportation
- Must have rowing experience
- Must have motor boat license (Pleasure Craft Operator)
- Must have First Aid/CPR/AED
- Previous coaching experience is an asset
- RCA Learn to Row Coach training is an asset
- Good communication and organizational skills
