

## **Club Programs Manager (1 Position)**

This role requires a strong ability to communicate to youth participants, athletes, adult participants and parents with clarity, in terms of program content as well as participant expectations, selection and participation. The Club Programs Manager will report to the Vice President Administration.

The Club Programs Manager will represent the program and the Club with professionalism, respect and leadership. The time commitment and compensation will be as follows:

35-40 hours/week for approx. 14 weeks @ \$19/hour. Starting as early as May 25, 2021

## **Responsibilities:**

- Lead role in overseeing the planning and development of a training program for competitive athletes (Youth Competitive, Masters, Adult Recreational) carried out by the Lead Program Coaches as well as the planning, development and implementation of the Sculling Development, Train to Train and Summer Camp programs.
- Coach the U23 Competitive program and oversee and organize Senior and Junior coaching support for the Summer Camp, Sculling Development, Youth Competitive (U17 & U19), Masters, Masters Development and Adult Recreational programs
- Provide mentoring of and direction to Lead Program , Senior and Junior Coaches.
- Provide technical feedback to athletes and coaches to facilitate athlete and coach development
- Responsible for general oversight of regatta planning and coordinating equipment usage and repairs/maintenance with the Lead Program Coaches
- Assist in the enforcement of SNRC rules & safety policies, including adherence to COVID restrictions
- · Continually work to promote and recruit members for the SNRC
- Maintain an energetic, inclusive and positive attitude toward all athletes and participants both on and off the water
- Providing timely and concise club communications regarding athlete, participant and parent
  expectations for club activities and events. These communications would be primarily focused on
  the Summer Camp, Sculling Development, Train to Train, Youth Competitive and U23 programs.
  Communications associated with the Masters, Masters Development and Adult Recreational
  programs will be handled by the Lead Coach Adult Programs.
- Assist Marketing Coordinator and Director, Marketing & Communications with school recruitment activities.
- Work with Club Administration Coordinator to manage program registrations, general club administration activities, member communications and club events.

## **Requirements:**

- Must be under 30 years of age (requirement for CSJ grant funding)
- Must have own transportation
- Must have competitive rowing experience
- Must have motor boat license (Pleasure Craft Operator)
- Must have current First Aid/CPR/AED certification (prior to start date)
- Must have previous competitive and recreational coaching experience
- · Must have good communication and organizational skills
- Must have completed a minimum of RCA Coach Weekend 1 training
- RCA Coach Weekend 2 and/or RCA Performance Coach training is an asset
