Coach Assistant (up to 4 Positions)

This role requires a strong ability to work with youth new to the sport of rowing and to provide an inclusive and supportive environment for their experience. The Coach Assistant will receive direction and guidance from Senior Coaches, Lead Program Coaches.

The Coach Assistant time commitment and compensation will be as follows:

Maximum of 30 hours a week for approximately 8 weeks @ \$17.00/hour starting June 24th, 2024 Allowances can be made for Coaches with their own training schedules.

The Coach Assistant position will be based out of the South Niagara Rowing Club location at 270 Colborne St in Welland, Ontario.

Responsibilities:

- Assist with planning, implementing, and operating our Youth Summer Camp program, which includes both half-day and full-day sessions, offering 11–15-year-olds the opportunity to learn the sport of rowing and develop new skills in a fun and supportive camp environment.
- Assist Learn to Row, Masters Development, Rowing Development and Train to Train program coaches.
- Assist the Lead Coaches, Youth Programs Manager and other coaches as required.
- Assist in the enforcement of SNRC rules & safety policies.
- Be active in SNRC promotional events.
- Maintain an energetic, inclusive, and positive attitude toward all athletes both on and off the water.
- Carry out fueling boat motors & docks cleaning.
- Assisting with general club clean up and maintenance.

Requirements:

- Must be under 30 years of age and be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee
 protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the
 employment, (requirement for CSJ grant funding)
- Must have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations
- Must have own transportation.
- Must have rowing experience as an athlete and/or coach.
- Must have Pleasure Craft Operator Card
- Must have current First Aid/CPR/AED certification (prior to start date).
- Must have completed a minimum of RCA Learn to Row Coach training (prior to start date).
- Good communication and organizational skills.
- Previous coaching experience is an asset.
