Senior Coach (up to 5 Positions)

This role requires a strong ability to communicate with clarity expectations to athletes (and their Guardians), in terms of, participation, selection, and development. The Senior Coach will report to the SNRC V.P. Rowing and will also receive direction and guidance from the Lead Program Coaches.

Senior Coaches will represent the Club with professionalism, respect, and contribute to a positive culture supported by South Niagara Rowing Club policies.

The time commitment and compensation will be as follows;

30 hours/week for approximately 10 weeks @ \$18.50/hour. Starting as early as June 3, 2024. The Senior Coach position will be based out of the South Niagara Rowing Club location at 270 Colborne St in Welland, Ontario. Allowances can be made for Coaches with their own training schedules.

Responsibilities:

- Assist with the development and implementation of a training program for competitive athletes in coordination with the Lead Program Coaches.
- Coach Adult and Youth programs including Junior Competitive, Master's Competitive, Master's Development, Train to Train, Learn to Row, Youth Summer Camp, and Rowing Development.
- Provide technical feedback to athletes and facilitate athlete development.
- Assist in the enforcement of SNRC rules & safety policies.
- Promoting and recruiting members for the SNRC.
- Maintain an energetic, inclusive, and positive attitude toward all athletes both on and off the water.
- Always maintain a safe athlete/participant environment.
- Fueling boat motors, daily maintenance of small boats and on-board safety equipment.
- Attend, and support athletes at regattas and organize equipment and boat trailers.
- Assist with general club clean up and maintenance.
- **Requirements:**
- Must be under 30 years of age and be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment, (requirement for CSJ grant funding)
- Must have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.
- Must have own transportation
- Must have competitive rowing experience as an athlete and/or coach.

- Must have current First Aid/CPR/AED certification (prior to start date)
- Must have good communication and organizational skills
- Must have completed a minimum of [RCA Coach Weekend 1](#) training (prior to start date)
- Previous coaching experience is a preferred asset.
